#### Leadership, Excellence, Achievement, Development (LEAD's):

Upon being elected in the Fall both LEAD's chairmen, Wiley (sophomore) and Finnegan (Junior), have made significant steps to improve our current LEAD's impact on candidates. We have structured one-hour sessions scheduled weekly for the candidates, the brothers are informed of what the candidates should know if they are inclined to give them a pop quiz during the remainder of the week. These sessions include guest speakers, classic LEAD's sessions, and Wiley and Finn's own customized sessions. We started off the semester strong with two sessions about house history and Gamma Kappa history stretching from Virginia Military Institute back in 1869 to Vance DeBrand all the way up till now. For our third session, we were lucky enough to have alumni advisory board member Randy Rowland come in and speak about what it means to be a Sigma Nu Gamma Kappa, how Gamma Kappa is unique, how the housing board and the alumni advisory board help the house, and his experience as a Gamma Kappa. Since then Wiley and Finn have led sessions about alcohol safety, sexual abuse on college campuses, and some Sigma Nu classics including "The White Star of Sigma Nu". We have big plans for the candidates as their process is slowly coming to an end but have been extremely impressed with their attentiveness and eagerness to learn.

LEAD's has been the backbone of the candidate process for decades but can be used to benefit the entire chapter given the members of the chapter are willing to participate beyond their candidate stage... and beyond the candidate stage it has gone! Both Wiley and Finn have been holding professional development workshops for those of the brothers that want to improve. We have not been following a rigid structure but hopping around the LEAD's handbook and skipping to sessions we feel our members will attend. This semester we have done two professional development workshops. One about resumes, where we were available to proofread, help construct, and give advice on resumes. For the second on interviews, we held mock interviews and gave interview advice to help the brothers with internship and job interviews this summer. Wiley and Finn are planning on hosting one more professional development workshop, but the topic will be up to the brothers and we are looking forward to it!

Overall, it has been a great semester thus far and we will continue the process of converting legion of honor boys to Gamma Kappa men.
